A Message from Philip Rogers President, Board of Trustees



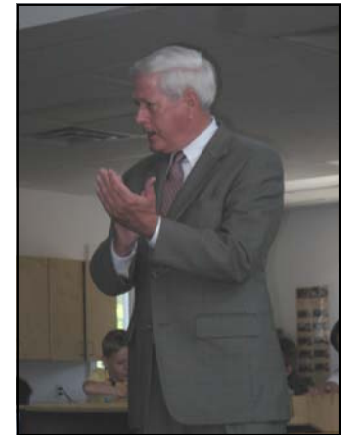

A Message from Bob Cipriani Treasurer, Board of Trustees

On behalf of the Trustees of Harborlight Montessori School, I am pleased to report on another strong year for Harborlight! While money is neither the essence nor the measure of success for our School, a solid financial foundation is essential to deliver Harborlight's mission on a daily basis. Our students remain at the center of every decision the Trustees make and our fiscal discipline has allowed us to maintain educational services as well as improve and grow our School in these tightening economic times.

Harborlight continues to rely on its historic strengths of fiscal discipline, closely monitored expenses, and a balanced operating budget. As a result, Harborlight is a financially stable school. Our fund balance and cash reserves continue to grow steadily and we have met all financial objectives set by the 2005-2010 strategic plan. Harborlight's financial stability reflects and supports the collective strengths of the entire school and facilitates the excellent education for which Harborlight is known.

These are exciting times for our School. Enrollment for grades 1-8 continues to grow ahead of projections and the Trustees are committed to accommodating all of the increasing needs of the School. The summer 2008 construction project is 90% complete, under budget, and the 3 new classrooms are on schedule to open in January 2009. The Trustees remain focused on the years ahead and committed to providing a comprehensive and meaningful learning environment for all current and future Harborlight students.

This fall the Trustees will be updating the Harborlight Strategic Plan to map the future direction of the School through the next 5 years. This plan will position Harborlight to exercise the ability to make significant choices and investments for the future. As the plan evolves, Harborlight's strong financial foundation will enable us to take decisive action and enhance our programs whenever the opportunity or need arises.

Thank you for taking the time to read the Annual Report. Harborlight Trustees are dedicated to providing financial transparency in all school matters and any questions or comments from the Harborlight community are always welcomed.

A Year in Review from the Head of School

Susan B. Egan, R.N., M.Ed.

I am very pleased to report that the Harborlight Montessori School has just completed another successful and productive year. The biggest accomplishment for the School this year is the accreditation by two important entities: the Association of Independent Schools of New England (AISNE) and the American Montessori Society (AMS). These new accreditations were added to the accreditations that the School currently has: National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC); and the Montessori School Accreditation Council (MSAC). In addition, the National Center for Montessori Education–New England (NCME-NE), which operates under the School, is accredited by the Montessori Accreditation Council for Teacher Education (MACTE).

Support Functions

Development

Harborlight started the year with a part-time Director of Development and was able to add hours to this position mid year. Great strides were made in the Development Program with Annual Fund proceeds totaling \$46,902.00. The Director of Development worked with the Annual Auction volunteers and together they produced a successful Annual Auction in April. Annual Auction 2008 realized gross proceeds of \$37,986.00 which netted \$29,212.00 for the Physical Education and Fitness Fund.

Library

The development of the School's Library/Multi-Media Center would not be possible without the fund raising activities of our volunteers. These efforts have resulted in a beautiful and functioning library enjoyed by the entire Harborlight community. The annual Scholastic Book Fairs raised \$3,299 this year towards the purchase of new books for the library. The School's part-time librarian works afternoons cataloging new books with our "state of the art" Athena Library System, and teaches computer and library skills to all of the students in the Elementary Program. There was \$9,955.00 in the library fund at year's end. Most of this was spent this past summer with the ordering of additional books.

Physical Fitness Initiative

The planning for the re-development and expansion of Harborlight's campus, including a gym and pool to be used for Physical Education, has been put on hold temporarily in order to begin the expansion project to accommodate the growing enrollment in the Upper Elementary Program.

Meaningful Faculty Evaluation (MFE)

Independent School Management (ISM) developed MFE as a staff development model. Harborlight instituted MFE 5 years ago in order to make sure that the School remains focused on the continual improvement of faculty performance. Each faculty member identifies areas in need of professional improvement. The program directors guide the faculty with goals for improvement for the academic year. The faculty action plan is instrumental in the direction of each teacher's professional advancement. Professional development for the faculty is supported by the Teacher Enrichment Fund (TEF) and Harborlight's Annual Operating Budget. The School spent a total of \$31,445.00 for professional development this past year which is considered exemplary by AISNE.

Technology Initiative

The Technology Fund was created in the fall of 2003 to provide funding for the capital expenses necessary to update aging computer technology. Proceeds from the 2004 *Get Connected!*, the 2005 *Harborlight Club*, and the 2006 *Casino Night* annual auctions were earmarked for the technology fund. This three-year fundraising effort raised a total of \$102,337.00 in support of the Harborlight Technology Fund. During the 2006/2007 fiscal year, the remaining balance in the Technology Fund [\$2,381.00] was used to purchase additional lap top computers. The current fund balance is \$0. Since the fund was depleted at the beginning of the 2007-2008, funds of approximately \$20,000.00 were taken from the general operating budget to cover necessary upgrades in technology. Expenses include computer terminal stations for the Early Childhood faculty; a new web site (to be launched soon) will include content that can be used by parents, students and faculty and managed by the school's administration; the addition and installation of 2 new servers; 10 new laptop computers; and battery back-ups for all of the servers.

Communications

Harborlight made a major effort to improve communications this year, and feedback from the parents is very positive. The quarterly newsletter, *The Beacon*, changed to a monthly format. Now 12 pages in length, it includes both past and future information regarding School events and includes many photos and articles by students. A hard copy is given to the parents and it is posted on the web site.

Finances

Harborlight will end with a budget surplus this year. The cash flow is lower due to the Summer Program enrollment being lower than usual this year. This is probably the result of the recession and the summer construction project. Collections continue to be problematic due, in part, to the economic picture and several parents have been laid off from work. The enrollment for the 2008-2009 school year is good which will make up for the lower projected income from the Summer Program. The School's cash reserves are invested in Morgan Stanley and will end the 2007-2008 year in the 300k range.

A Year in Review from the Head of School

Facilities

Harborlight's safety and security has been improved this past year with the addition of a needed Director of Safety and Security. This is an expanded responsibility that was given to the Assistant Director of Facilities who has served in the past as a licensed EMT, police officer, and volunteer firefighter.

Harborlight ended the 2007-2008 fiscal year with the beginning of a major 5,000 square foot addition to the 2nd floor which will house the Upper Elementary Program. The project is budgeted at \$535,000.00 and is slated for completion in January 2009. The School is very fortunate to have two licensed and experienced builders plus the Director of Finance on staff who also built 10 other additions to the School.

Board of Trustees

The governance provided by the Board of Trustees is invaluable in planning for the future growth and development of the School. With planning by the Treasurer, Harborlight has its pre-paid tuition funds invested in higher interest accounts. The Trustee Committee was successful in profiling and recruiting additional board members for the upcoming Academic Year 2008-2009. After 3 year terms, four trustees resigned from the Board at the end of June and seven new trustees joined the Board bringing the total number of trustees up to 17 for 2008-2009.

Student Programs

Testing

Harborlight students continue to soar on academic achievement tests. In the spring of 2008, they scored an average of 3.8 grade levels ahead of their actual grade levels! These scores have been increasing every year. The student's scores were an average of 3.4 grade levels higher than their actual grade levels in the spring of 2007.

Community Service

As part of the curriculum, students support several charities as well as visit patients in the nursing home next to the campus. The Annual Empty Bowl Dinner raised \$2,873.00 this year and the Middle School Car Wash raised another \$600.00. The proceeds were sent to Beverly Boot Straps to support their food pantry. Students also participated in a Mathathon to raise money for St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital. The Harborlight community donated items to the Salvation Army and purchased flowers on Daffodil Days to support the American Cancer Society's research efforts. The students also collected money for UNICEF during "Trick or Treat" on Halloween. Middle school graduates did community oriented projects for their year-long 8th grade presentations, including: volunteering and supporting the Beverly Boot Straps, working with Beverly city officials to research recycling in the city; clearing trash from the parks and woods in Beverly; and making a sign/map and information sheet for Dog Town Woods in Gloucester.

Clubs and Classes

Harborlight continued the very popular Chess Club while introducing new options in the After School Program this past year including Chinese, Lego Mindstorms, flag football; cooking and cocina (Hispanic cooking). The community embraced all of these new clubs and classes.

Closing Remarks

Harborlight's 35th anniversary year was a big success – starting with the accreditation of the School by AISNE and AMS in the fall, to enjoying the Anniversary Jazz Brunch at Danversport Yacht Club in the winter, partying at the Annual Auction in the spring, and relaxing at the Annual Family Picnic at Lynch Park. Many wonderful plays and programs were presented by the students, and the year ended with the Annual Carnival and graduation ceremonies. Harborlight has moved forward in a very positive direction. The Management Team's goal for continuous improvement in all aspects of operations has proven very fruitful. The Meaningful Faculty Evaluation Program (MFE) has helped teachers to reach for new and elevated professional goals. Their efforts have guided the students to reach for and attain even greater heights than predicted. Every day students and teachers work on maximizing their potential as we continually strive to fulfill our motto:

"Shoot for the moon even if you miss you'll land among the stars." Striving for excellence helps to attain excellence. We never settle for mediocrity at Harborlight!

Thank you to the retiring, returning, new trustees, donors, and volunteers for your generous support and belief in the Harborlight dream and mission. I look forward to working together with the Board and the Management Team as we strive to grow, improve and develop the School to its fullest potential. The community's support is crucial as we move forward to the next phase in Harborlight's development. It's been an honor and a privilege to lead Harborlight since founding it 35 years ago, and I am just as excited and energized to lead the community into the future.

The Green School Initiative started in 2007-2008 in an attempt to establish "Green" policies and create an Environmental Curriculum within the School. One goal for the Initiative has been to strengthen the School's recycling program. The Middle School has been charged with overseeing the daily operations of this recycling program and has made great progress. The largest addition to the recycling program is the Paper Retriever. Some of Harborlight's other behind-the-scenes activities include: well water irrigation, energy star lighting, and the composting of yard waste. One of the Initiative's biggest long term goals is to attain LEED certification for the School.

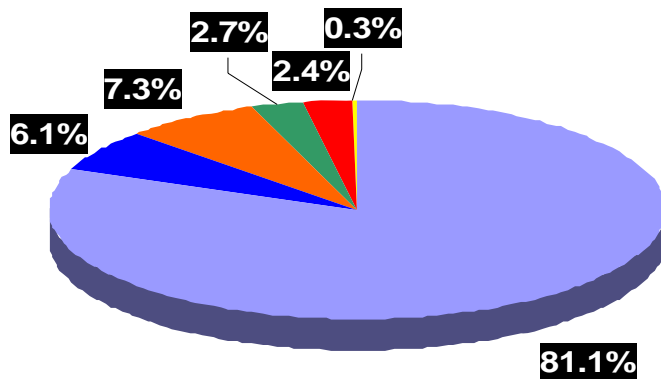

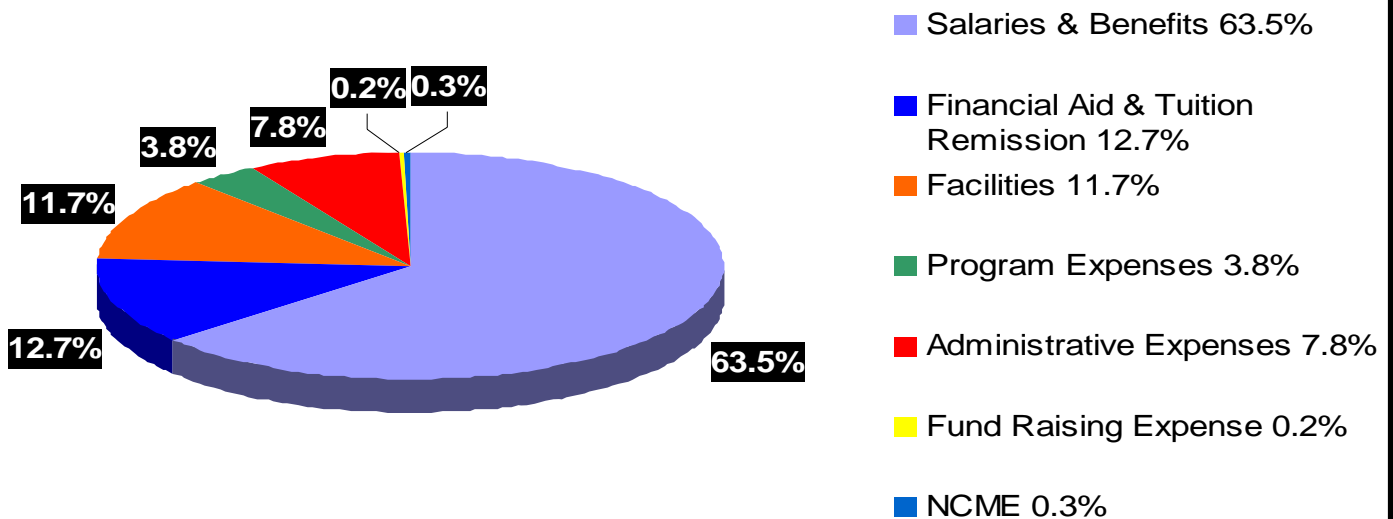
